2. Which three large bodies of water are named in this map? [Mediterranean, Black, and Caspian Seas](#)
3. Locate the cities where Galen studied and worked: Smyrna, Alexandria, and Pergamum. [See the red circles on left side of the map](#)
4. What country now occupies the city of Pergamum? [Turkey](#)
